Items purchased from C.J's:

- Purchased 13 cases of Sausage with 48 sausage links in a box (13 x \$17.98 = \$233.74.
 Previously purchased 11 Cases of 100 sausage links (\$24.57/case = \$270.27) Will need to investigate packaging of sausage with vendor.
- Didn't purchase syrup had enough in inventory Previously purchased: 2 cases of syrup,
 4 gallons/case (\$22.95/case = \$45.90)
- Didn't purchase diet syrup had enough in inventory *Previously purchased : 4 bottles of Diet Syrup (\$1.92/bottle = \$7.68)*
- Provided 18 syrup dispensers at no charge

NOTE: Knights of Columbus has delivered a check to CJ's and returned syrup bottles.

Logistics:

- Did not have the large griddle from Terry Kuper. Will need to investigate future usage of the large griddle. Knight Jim Woodward and Field Agent Jason Bramley are investigating possible usage and/or purchasing a griddle from St. Mary's Downs Knights of Columbus.
- No member from the Knights made a commitment prior to the event to bring a roaster until the day of the event; the Knights may need to investigate purchasing 2 roasters for future events. With a goal of purchasing a total of 4 roasters.
- To accommodate the Pancake Breakfast the RICA class was moved and the Knights provided the group with pancakes and sausage.
- The food permit was submitted by Tony McCauley to the Health Department for approval. Jeff Lopez served as the contact host for the event. Permit needs to be submitted 10 days prior to the event to avoid paying a fee.
- Used a free on-line sign up website for volunteers to sign up for designated time slots. Will need to discuss with Knights if this website was beneficial. For future sign ups should have a slot that says: "will not volunteer/attend" this way we can verify if everyone is reading their email.
- John Fruin followed up to ensure that General Liability Insurance was in place.

Comments and Suggestions:

- We had a total of 9 griddles and created 3 stations with 3 griddles at each location. This set up worked well.
- We had 2 stations with 2 roasters set up for distribution of pancakes and sausage. One station was on the north and one station was the south wall of the Parish Hall to distribute pancakes and sausage.
- Having the 5 gallon bucket, electric drill and drill bit was very beneficial in making the pancake batter.
- Would suggest that we remove 5 tables from set up in Shamrock Hall to create more community
- We may want to investigate purchasing cooking sheet pans with lips for cooking sausage in oven and purchasing 2 roasters.
- Set up was done by parish staff (Doug) and clean-up was done by Knights. We could have used additional volunteers' to complete task in a timely fashion.
- Frozen blueberries and strawberries are a HIT...continue offering
- May need to be aware of other happening within B/N since the Kiwanis had a Pancake Breakfast on the same date. Along with District 87 having a four day weekend Friday, Saturday, Sunday and Monday. Unit 5 also had a four day weekend Saturday, Sunday, Monday, and Tuesday due to President Day and teacher in-service.
- Would investigate coordinating with Religious Education program to create placemats for Advent and Lent. Possible suggestion would be to have a child the program to color/draw a picture. This could be used as a marketing tool to attract families to the pancake breakfast.
- Need to investigate other options for distribution of tickets. Possible suggestion is to have Knights stand at the exits of the church and distribute ticket to parishioners as they leave the church at the conclusion of mass.
- Need to be aware of grease splatter on soffits, back splash and down the side of cabinets.
